IACF Walkathon raises \$5,000 for local charity causes

A new venue and a new contest were featured at the Indo-American Charity Foundation's annual walkathon to raise funds for local charities and student scholarships.

The event, which has been held at the Bear Creek Park for the last several years, was shifted to Rice stadium this year. Another new feature was a contest to cook the best 'Kadhi' and it seemed to generate a very good response with 20 individuals and organizations taking part. The BAPS volunteers set up a kitchen and served hot pav-bhaii to all the participants. Some youngsters set up a face-painting area and delighted dozens of small children with their work of art.
